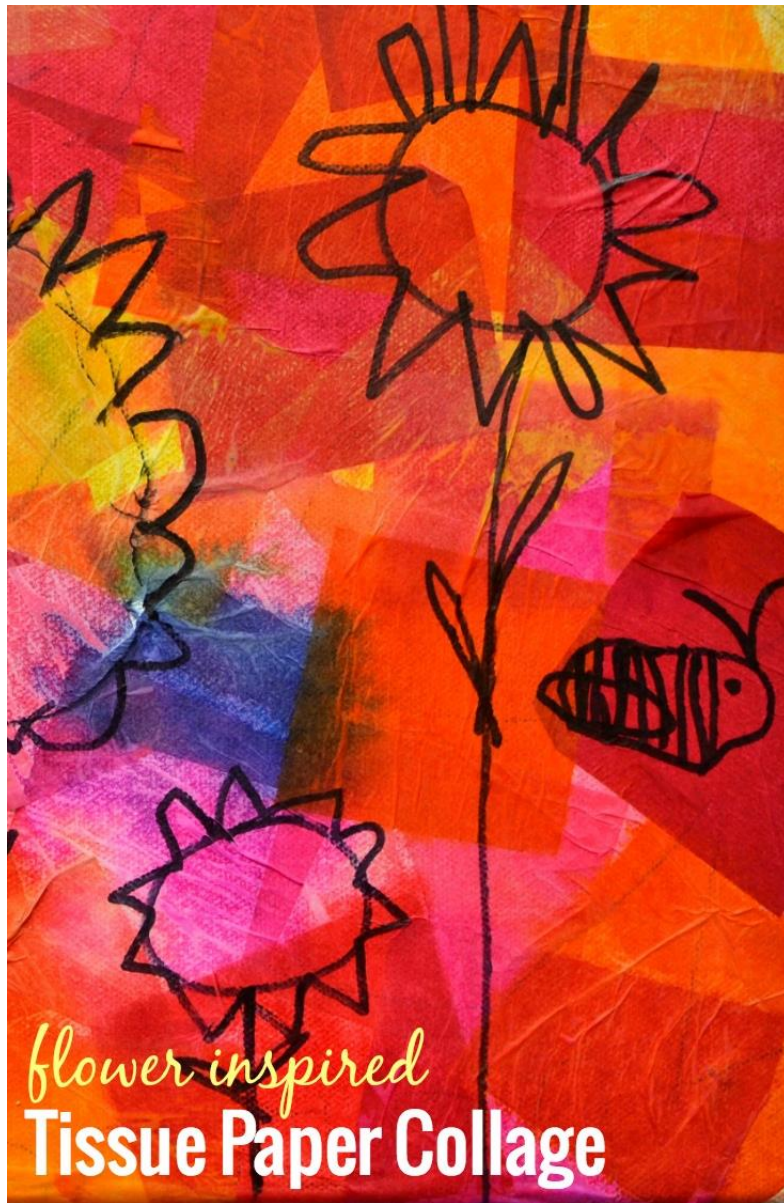

Flower Garden Tissue Paper Collage



STEAM Question: Can you create a flower garden out of tissue paper?

Objective: Students will make a flower garden out of tissue paper.

Materials:

- Book, "From Seed to Plant"
- Tissue Paper
- Glue mixed with water (2:1)
- Paint brush
- Canvas
- Permanent Marker



Teaching Strategy:

Read the book, "From Seed to Plant", to learn how seeds grow into plants and flowers.

Tear tissue paper into pieces and lay on the canvas. Cover the tissue paper with glue.

Encourage students to cover the entire canvas by overlapping shapes. Let dry completely.

Once the canvas is dry, draw a flower garden by drawing with the marker on top of the dried tissue paper.

Guiding Questions:

What type of bugs or insects would you see in a garden?

What are other types of flowers in your garden?

What other things do we see in a garden?



STEAM Experience:

Science: Research seed germination.

Technology: Use paint brushes as tools to spread the glue.

Engineering: Research how is a flower garden made.

ARTs: Students observe color mixing by placing two pieces of tissue paper on top of each other.

Math: Count the number of tissue paper squares used for each canvas.
